### From the Pastor's Desk...

The Pastoral Search: Not an Easy Task

As we reach July next month, our Pastoral Search will have been going on for 3 years. In this month's column I would like to pull back the curtain and show the church some of the work that occurs in the search for a pastoral candidate. To do this, I want to break this column into two parts- 1) The formation of the Pastoral Search Committee (PSC), 2) The search process once a resume arrives to the PSC.

- 1. Forming the PSC. Our Constitution states that the Committee consists of 5 people; Two deacons, one trustee, and two people from the congregation. Currently, in our case, we also have one pastoral advisor. The desired traits of the people on the PSC are: people of prayer, know the word of God, evidence of Godly wisdom, discernment, commitment and a team player. The foundation for their search is found in I Timothy 3:1-7 where the characteristics of a pastor are outlined. I encourage you to read that before continuing here.
- 2. Once the PSC is formed the work begins. A survey is prepared for the congregation to get an idea of what the congregation desires in a pastor. This is distributed, then collected and the results compiled. This goes out to the source that the PSC will use to gather resumes.

A resume packet arrives in the form of a) A written, personal testimony of how the person came to salvation, b) the person's resume and c) A nine page questionnaire that is filled out by each applicant. Since these are fill in the blank questions, the size of the completed document can vary from 9 pages up to 20-25, depending on how verbose the applicant is. Once the resume packet arrives, it is distributed to each PSC member to pray over, review, and then bring their findings to a group meeting where the applicant is discussed.

In the discussion, the following criteria is reviewed (and this is NOT an exhaustive list):

- Personal information about applicant; Education, Work History, Positions served in prior churches, Effectiveness of past service, Length of tenure at prior positions (short or long stays?), Looking for gaps or missing years in past history
- Their agreement with our Declaration of Faith
- Their vision for church growth
- Views about youth, adult and senior ministry
- Views on marriage, divorce and re-marriage
- Support of wife and family in his ministry work
- Type of worship service desired

- The end times position of the applicant
- Spiritual gifts and their usage
- View on evangelism
- Plan for Leadership development
- Views on pastoral care and visitation
- And a myriad of others too long to list here

Once the above have been reviewed, if there is a unanimous decision by the PSC, then video of the person is viewed and if still a yes, then a phone interview is done. Following this, if still a go, then references are checked, still a go, then a personal visit is arranged. If after that it is still a go, then the candidate is asked to fill the pulpit and speak, and then a vote requiring 90% approval is required.

Now, this paragraph is very important so <u>please read it</u> <u>very carefully</u>. All of the above is super-intended by the Holy Spirit, from the PSC formation through the final selection. The PSC is Spirit led because they and we as a church want God's man at God's time. At any point in the process it could be a no, and the PSC then goes to the next resume and begins the process over. So, as you can see, the PSC process is not a simple one.

Finally, the pool of pastors has shrunk considerably since Covid. Many pastors retired and not a large number of applicants are available. Note these statistics - only 10% of the pastors active today are under the age 40. And 60% of the active Pastors are over the age of 60. That leaves a small percentage indeed of pastors aged 40-60. So, please continue to pray for the PSC, for as you can see, theirs is not an easy task!
